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## Overview

Interprofessional education (IPE) is defined by the World Health Organization as “When students from two or more professions learn about, from, and with each other to enable effective collaboration and improve health outcomes.”

Saint Louis University's interprofessional education (IPE) program offers both a concentration and a minor in interprofessional practice for undergraduate students interested in a career in health-related professions. The three courses in the concentration have been aligned to meet six attributes of the Undergraduate University Core (UUC), so it is an efficient way for students to meet both IPE and UUC requirements.
