ARABIC - BEGINNING, MICROCREDENTIAL (MADRID)

The microcredential in beginning Arabic consists of six required credit hours offered at Saint Louis University-Madrid only. Satisfactory completion of the required courses allows the student to develop the skills to conduct beginning-level communication in Arabic through the acquisition of appropriate vocabulary, grammar, reading, writing, listening comprehension, speaking capabilities, and an introduction to Arabic-speaking culture.

The microcredential in beginning Arabic aligns itself with similar programs both at SLU-Madrid, and in the Department of Languages, Literatures, and Cultures in St. Louis, in that it is designed to help students gain a broader understanding of themselves, as well as the languages and cultures of others.
