LATIN - INTERMEDIATE, MICROCREDENTIAL

The microcredential in intermediate Latin consists of six required credit hours. Satisfactory completion of the required courses allows the student to develop the necessary skills to conduct intermediate-level comprehension in Latin through the acquisition of appropriate vocabulary, grammar, reading, writing, listening comprehension, speaking capabilities, and an introduction to cultures using Latin as a language to communicate.
