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## **Continuation Standards**

Students must earn a grade of "C" or higher in all courses used to fulfill the minor.

If their GPA falls below a 2.70, students will have one semester to increase their GPA to a 2.70 or they will not be allowed to enroll in 3000 or 4000-level accounting courses.
